Child marriage – marriage before the age of 18 – is a human rights violation. Despite laws against it, the harmful practice remains widespread. Child marriage can lead to a lifetime of suffering. Girls who marry before they

Main indicators. In 2003, UNICEF and partners agreed to focus on five indicators related to child marriage: Percentage of women 20 to 49 first married or in union by age 15 and 18, by age group. Percentage of girls 15 to 19 years of age currently married or in union. Spousal age difference.

Child marriage – a marriage or union before the age 18 – has a disproportionate impact on girls. It curtails their education, compromises their health, exposes them to violence and traps them in poverty, undermining their prospects and potential.

In West and Central Africa, UNICEF will carry out these integrated strategies to accelerate progress toward change. Supporting adolescent girls at risk of, or affected by, child marriage to stay in school through the lower secondary cycle and acquire life skills, enabling them to make choices and exercise their rights.

Adolescents are sometimes exposed to sexual activity at initiation ceremonies, which can lead to sex with peers and early marriages. UNICEF is working with the Government of Malawi to protect girls and boys from sexualized violence including child marriage and other harmful traditional practices.

The practice of child marriage has continued to decline around the world. Based on the latest data available from each country, 21 per cent of young women (aged 20 to 24) were married as children. This represents a decrease from 25 per cent 10 years ago, driven predominantly by progress in India.

Child Marriage - UNICEF DATA

Child marriage is a marriage or similar union, formal or informal, between an adult and a child under a certain age, typically age eighteen. The child can be a girl or a boy, but the large majority of child marriages are between a girl and a man, and are rooted in gender inequality.

proportion of young women who were married as children decreased by 15 per cent, from 1 in 4 (25%) to approximately 1 in 5 (21%). Still, approximately 650 million girls and women alive today were married before their 18th birthday.

Child Marriage: Latest trends and future ... - UNICEF DATA

In the countries with data, on average, 4.5 per cent of young men aged 20–24 years were first married or in union before age 18, with a range of values from less than 1 per cent to nearly 30 per cent. Data from all regions show that the practice has become less common compared to 25 years ago.
