Just Culture is a concept related to systems thinking which emphasizes that mistakes are generally a product of faulty organizational cultures, rather than solely brought about by the person or persons directly involved. In a just culture, after an incident, the question asked is, "What went wrong?" rather than "Who caused the problem?". A just culture is the opposite of a blame culture.

It's called just culture as opposed to a culture of blame. It's a change of how errors are perceived and acted upon by an organization. When an organization embraces a just culture, it is more likely to have fewer adverse incidents and caregivers in that organization are more likely to self-report errors or near misses.

In 2011, the Agency for Healthcare Research and Quality found that only 44% of hospital employees felt comfortable reporting errors. That illustrates how far we have to go in creating a "Just Culture" and, therefore, a safer system for patients. Fear of reporting allows errors to be repeated, sometimes with devastating results.
